



How are Service Dogs Processed

- 1. Sponsor sends a check and Completed Sponsor Form
- 2. Check and form are processed
- 3. Payment sent to provider
- 4. Updates provided at the following milestones:
 - 2 -month puppy letter and certificate with photo
 - 6-month puppy letter update letter
 - In for Training letter and certificate with photo
 - Graduation letter and certificate with photo

Timeline of breeding, raising, training, and placing a service dog:

2 months: Puppy Named and sent to be raised with a raiser or prison program

15-16 months: Dog brought back to campus for formal training

18-20 months: Dog completes formal training

21-22 months: Dog is matched and trained with veteran and graduates








Delphi AHEPA




